How does my students' school perform academically and how do I learn more about the school they attend?

This summer we recommend the following 3 steps to discover where your child is academically, how to plan your route ahead and utilize resources to keep your child learning this summer.

Step 1: Know Where You Are and How to Proceed

Learning Heroes uses national research to inform and equip parents with the knowledge they need to best support their children's educational journey. The Readiness Check is a quick math and reading review that will allow you to discover where your child is academically and how to proceed accordingly.

Step 2: Expectations

It is also helpful to understand learning expectations for each grade level. The Parent Teacher Association (PTA) formulated guides for each grade level that outlines expectations in English language arts, and math. <u>These guides are available in English and Spanish here</u>.



Step 3: Resources

Summer is an important time for children to continue learning and reinforce what they have already learned. Here are a few resources we recommend.

The Commissioner's Summer Math Challenge

Stressing the importance of maintaining math skills during the summer, schools compete based on student population and grade level. The program identifies the schools with the highest percentage of participating enrollment and the highest number of badges earned by participating students. Connecticut Summer Math Passport Tasks include Beach, Farmer's Market, Gardening, Hiking, Ice cream, Movement, Playground. The Governor's Summer Reading Challenge

It's that time of year again to encourage students to participate in CONNECTICUT READS, the 2022 Governor's Summer Reading Challenge! To support summer reading, the Connecticut State Library's statewide eGo eBook platform is now available through many local public libraries, and provides access to digital resources for all ages. Research shows that reading is crucial to a child's brain development and intellectual stimulation. Reading opens the door to all other skills. Read every day. Talk about what you're reading. 3 Questions to ask your teacher during summer break

If you have the opportunity to talk with your child's teacher start by asking these questions. A meaningful conversation with your child's teacher can help you ensure your student's summer is enriching and fun.

- 1. Can you share information about my students' progress?
- 2. Is there anything specific you would recommend my student work on this summer?
- 3. What are my students' strengths and weaknesses?



According to the Brown University study on the impact summer learning loss has on K-12 students, the average student lost 17-34% of the previous year's learning gains. This is why it is so important to reinforce learning during the summer.
